Even so, manufacturers and retailers still convince us to renew and replace the things we own based on some arbitrary expiration date, dictated least of all by the continuing efficacy of our current belongings.

Disrupting this arc of consumption, six international and local artists transform the status of these objects from their quotidian tasks. Expanding the meaning and limiting the function of discarded objects, these artists provoke a new way of viewing our contemporary environment. Extending the dialogue started by Marcel Duchamp, mundane goods are sliced, stacked, balanced, and melted into extraordinary pieces.

Art of the Ordinary is the first exhibition for Arc One Gallery in 2011.
